 Yes, he/she is. / No, he/she isn't.

This is my favourite scarf.  
 These are my favourite tights.  
 Do you like my hat?  
 I love my scarf.  
 What a fancy hat!

 No, he/she doesn't.

Is there any/some/a lot of/lots of broccoli?  
 Yes, there is. / No, there isn't.  
 Are there any peas?  
 Yes, there are. / No, there aren't.
